

Respondent appeared by its authorized representative Tiffany Irizarry.

Petitioner appeared by Sr. Inspector Monica Dorson.

Summons No. 000993807H

This charge is for idling a motor vehicle for more than three minutes.

Inspector Dorson submitted photos and a video of the truck in question and a redacted idling complaint.

After reviewing the video Inspector Dorson stated that the truck was idling for more than three minutes, that there was someone sitting in the driver's seat and there was no loading or unloading or a processing device in use.

Ms. Irizarry stated that the driver was probably waiting for the traffic to clear before driving away.

I find that Petitioner established a prima facie case of idling a motor vehicle for more than three minutes and that there was no loading or unloading and no processing device in use.

Respondent's argument is not credible and does not establish a defense to the idling charge.

Accordingly the summons is **sustained**.

Summons No. 001001466K

This charge is for idling a motor vehicle for more than three minutes.

Inspector Dorson submitted photos and a video of the truck in question and a redacted idling complaint.

After reviewing the video Inspector Dorson stated that the truck was idling and a person was sitting in the driver's seat inside the truck.

Ms. Irizarry stated that the driver was trying to merge into traffic and then drove away.

I find that Petitioner established a prima facie case of idling a motor vehicle for more than three minutes. Respondent's argument is not credible and does not establish a defense to the idling charge.

Accordingly the summons is **sustained**.

Summons No. 001001468Y

This charge is for idling a motor vehicle for more than one minute while adjacent to a school or park.

Inspector Dorson submitted photos and a video of the truck in question and a redacted idling complaint.

After reviewing the video Inspector Dorson stated that the truck was idling for more than one minute adjacent to a school and that there was no loading or unloading.

Ms. Irizarry stated that the driver of the truck appears to be leaving and that the place of occurrence is a church not a school.

I find that Petitioner established a prima facie case of idling a motor vehicle for more than one minute adjacent to a school and that a school is located within the church building at the subject place of occurrence. Respondent's argument to the contrary is without merit and does not establish a defense to the idling charge.

Accordingly the summons is **sustained**.

Summons no. 001001469X

This charge is for idling a motor vehicle for more than three minutes.

Inspector Dorson submitted photos and a video of the truck in question and a redacted idling complaint.

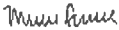
After reviewing the video Inspector Dorson stated that the flatbed truck in question was idling for more than three minutes and parked near a construction site and that there was no loading or unloading or a processing device in use.

Ms. Irizarry stated that the driver of the truck was waiting to enter a construction site and that the flatbed truck's engine was running because the engine was needed to power a special break and also that there were people who were actively working.

I find that Petitioner established a prima facie case of idling a motor vehicle for more than three minutes and that there was no loading or unloading and no processing device in use.

Respondent's argument does not establish a defense to the idling charge as leaving the truck's engine on to operate a break is not an exemption to the idling statute.

Accordingly the summons is **sustained**.
