Findings of Fact & Conclusions of Law

Petitioner NYPD was not present and respondent Zui Y Mann appeared by Michael Nacmias. The summons alleged a violation NYC Administrative Code 19-190(b), stating "Def't did strike bicyclist crossing the right of way in the crosswalk. Def't was making a right turn.

Respondent requested dismissal for various reasons: i) no prima facie case as no allegation of physical injury, an essential component of a charge under 19-190(b); ii) not sure if section applies if a bicyclist, as opposed to a pedestrian, is involved; iii) no allegation that respondent was driving a motor vehicle; iv) no mention of basis for issuing officer's knowledge of an incident they did not state they personally observed.

I credit respondent's argument that the summons fails to set forth a violation of 19-190(b) because no physical injury is alleged and for that reason dismiss the summons.

For the record, the statute specifically covers a "person riding a bicycle:" that respondent was alleged to be making a right turn is sufficient to infer he was driving a motor vehicle (which respondent did not deny); and hearsay from someone at the location is admissible, although subject to a credibility weighting (again not denied by respondent).
