Findings of Fact & Conclusions of Law

The hearing was conducted by telephone on Court Call on April 9, 2025. Petitioner did not appear. Respondent was represented by Michael Nacmias, Esq.

The summons charged a violation of 19-190(b) of the Administrative Law, failure to yield to a pedestrian with right of way, causing physical injury. The details of the charge read, "right of way -failure to yield causing physical injury." Respondent argued the allegations in the summons were conclusory and merely restated the charge, and did not state a prima facie case.

On the threshold issue of jurisdiction, respondent challenged service because the summons was blank and unsigned.

Petitioner is required by 48 RCNY § 6-08(a)(1) to file proof of service with OATH. Failure to do so or offer evidence of service at the hearing means the summons must be dismissed for defective service. NYPD v. J. Doe, Appeal No. 2200921 (August 30, 2022). Accordingly, the summons is dismissed.
