Findings of Fact & Conclusions of Law

Petitioner did not appear. Respondent appeared through attorney Michael Nacmias.

Summons 0218958612 charged a violation of Administrative Code § 19-190(b) for failing to yield at a crosswalk resulting in physical injury to a pedestrian or cyclist.

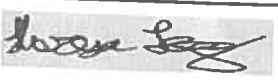
The issuing officer wrote, "vehicle failure to yield causing collision and injury to pedestrian." On the second page, the "Affidavit (Certificate) of Service" is blank.

Respondent moved to dismiss for defective service and for failure to plead a prima facie case of the violation as it fails to plea any specific facts about the Respondent, but is just a conclusion of law.

Section 19-190(b) imposes a fine on a motor vehicle that fails to yield to a pedestrian, comes in contact with the pedestrian and causes a physical injury.

Before turning to the merits of the summons, service must be established. Per 48 RCNY § 6-08(a)(1), Petitioner is required to file proof of service before the hearing. Here, Petitioner has filed the summons without proof of service. Accordingly, the summons is dismissed.

Had service been effective, the summons would be dismissed for failure to plead adequate details of the violation.
