Findings of Fact & Conclusions of Law

Michael Nacmias appeared on behalf of Respondent Sameer Keshwani.

Respondent is charged with "AC 19-190(b)." Right of way. Failure to Yield. Petitioner alleges driver failed to yield the right of way to a pedestrian crossing the crosswalk causing the vehicle to contact the pedestrian's right leg. Pedestrian complained of pain and was treated on scene.

Mr. Nacmias states respondent denies the allegation. He states petitioner has failed to make out a prima facie case in that it did not allege respondent was in a motor vehicle and did not adequately allege serious physical injury. Further, petitioner's

Affidavit of Service is blank therefore service is defective.

I credit respondent's evidence and find he has rebutted petitioner's evidence that he failed to yield the right of way to the pedestrian. However, I find this summons is defective because the violation details fail to make out a prima facie case of the charge in that it fails to indicate that respondent was driving. Further, petitioner has failed to prove effective service.

I do not credit petitioner's evidence and find respondent is not in violation.

As such, this summons must be dismissed.
