Findings of Fact & Conclusions of Law

Michael Nacmias, Esq., attorney for the respondent, appeared via telephone conference call on 7/29/25. No appearance on behalf of petitioner NYPD.

Respondent was charged with violating AC 19-190(b), failure to yield-physical injury.

Respondent's attorney argued that petitioner has failed to make a prima facie case because the summons does not allege a physical injury which is an element of the charge, nor does the summons establish a right of way. Respondent's attorney argues that the summons also doesn't allege that the respondent is the motorist. Respondent's attorney requested that the

summons be dismissed mostly on the grounds that the physical injury component is missing from the summons, and that it is required that to establish this charge, petitioner has to state a physical injury or substantial impairment.

I agree with respondent's counsel and find tht the summons fails to make out a prima facie case on the grounds that it fails to provide any specific details of the charge and thus fails to meet the requirements of the statue. I find that there is nothing in the summons to indicate that a physical injury was sustained, and as such petitioner has failed to establish a valid charge. The summons is dismissed accordingly.
